If you are looking for more worldview discussion literature, I would read <i>The Giver</i> by Lois Lowery and use the same assessment tool that you used for the other novels.	
History (Each chapter of WEC directs the use of <i>Calendar Quest</i> , the timeline, coloring book, and HFS.)		Start/finish <i>Lessons on Time</i> .	Start WEC (This may take you a good ways into the second semester depending on how much time you spend each week).	Finish WEC.	<i>Family Tree</i> *** Research phase (largely a history activity).

** You don't necessarily need to finish *Conversations* before you start CTAP, but you do need to finish *Secret of the Scribe*. You may be doing *Conversations* as a family after dinner, or you may alternate your school days with CTAP and *Conversations* until *Conversations* is finished. CTAP will take most (if not all) of the year, so I don't want you to postpone starting that if you are taking a more leisurely pace through *Conversations*.
